DIVISIONAL ORDER

For cases filed in the Tyler Division in the categories listed below in Schedule I, the Clerk of Court will randomly assign a Tyler Division magistrate judge as the presiding judge and send to each party, upon the party's appearance in the case, a form to consent to proceed before the magistrate judge for all purposes under 28 U.S.C. § 636(c). The magistrate judge may also invite party consent. If the parties consent, the magistrate judge is designated to exercise full § 636(c) jurisdiction, including holding trial and entering judgment. If the parties do not consent timely, as determined by the magistrate judge, a Tyler Division district judge will be assigned as the presiding judge, but the case will remain referred to the assigned magistrate judge to the full extent authorized by 28 U.S.C. § 636(b). This order applies to cases filed on or after March 1, 2025.
